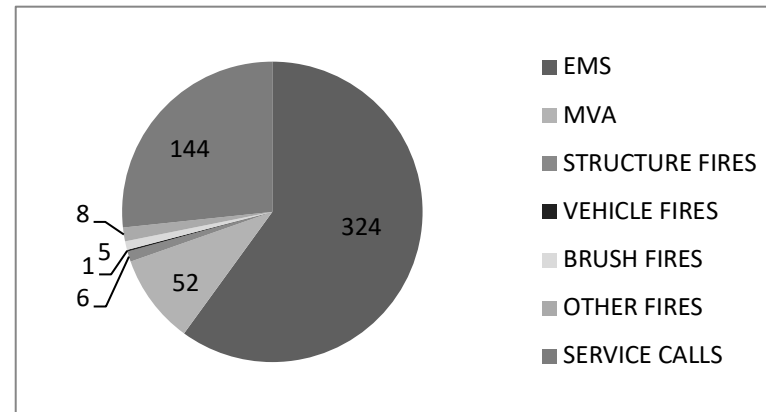
- Leadership experience and social network development

Members completed 3,905 hours of training in 2018, earning multiple nationally-recognized certifications. Training came from various sources to include in-house, Tennessee Fire and Codes Academy, Tennessee Emergency Management Agency, and fire service conferences.

The department has a dedicated training facility that is utilized to train our members and host State Certified training classes.

Support members do not require this level of training to provide a wide variety of assistance to department operations.
